

Patagonia Trip

What a glorious Texas Ski Council trip to South America led by Betty Graham. We begin our fabulous trip by flying to Santiago, Chile where we saw some of the highlights of this beautiful old city. After a night of rest we went on to Easter Island flying west for 3-1/2 hours over the Pacific Ocean to our remote destination. Our Eco-lodging included Polynesian entertainment with fine dining and excellent daily tours.

The highlight of this sparsely inhabited island is the Moai statues. These 30 meter tall carved statues were located in many parts of the island often close to the ocean. The theory is they were chiseled by hand from the mountainous volcanic rock in honor of the local Kings. The mystery is how they were moved to the ocean side. These stately sentinels continue to amaze all who see them.

One interesting piece of information we learned was that the 2 mile long runway which we landed on and the main road for the island were constructed by NASA in 1965 to insure that our space shuttle had a safe alternate place to land in case of emergency. Our guide spoke glowingly of the Americans who came to work there for many months to complete this project. They are all still appreciative of the extremely well-constructed runway and road which have been well used for over 50 years.

After flying back to Santiago we met up with our main group and continued our journey into the Chilean part of Patagonia, then further into the Andes Mountain range to the Argentinian Patagonia where we continued to view incredibly beautiful landscape and glaciers. We hiked for miles as well as having boat rides to see the stunning natural sites.

On to grand Buenos Aires where the world's widest 22-lane boulevard leads to the Colon Opera House and beautiful Colonial architecture. An evening of Tango lessons, wine tasting and fine dining was capped by a fabulous Tango show. We were fascinated with the Recoleta area including the cemetery where Eva Peron now rests. Funky, artistic Boca was a favorite of all.

Our post trip to Mendoza wine country proved to be amazing, where we enjoyed incredible dinners paired with the locally produced wines. The most adventurous part of our group managed to have one last thrill on the morning of our departure by taking a very challenging hike into the Andes and rappelling down 140 meters !

We had one big spectacular group happy hour at our hotel and on our way back home several of our members managed to get all of us into the Admirals club in Santiago where we were well-fortified for the final leg of our journey back to DFW.

Big Sky, Montana Trip

We kicked off the 2018-2019 ski season with a trip to Big Sky, Montana. Nineteen club members made the trip, and it was the first Dallas Ski Club ski trip for nine of our new members. This was a Texas Ski Council trip so we were joined by ski clubs from all over Texas and Oklahoma.

We flew into Bozeman, MT on American Airlines on Saturday and were met by our shuttle service, Big Sky Shuttle for the ride to Big Sky. The group stayed at the Huntley Lodge in the Mountain Village right at the base of the new Ramcharger lift and the older Swift Current lift. The Ramcharger is an eight passenger lift (the first 8 in North America) with heated seats and a pull-down bubble for comfort. The Huntley provided a delicious full breakfast buffet every morning to start the day.

Sunday was a good day to explore the mountain and take some practice runs on the NASTAR race course in preparation for the TSC races on Wednesday. That evening the TSC held the welcome reception with snacks and information about the resort presented by Big Sky hosts and our tour operator. Monday we received a light snow overnight. Tuesday saw many of us made the trip to Yellowstone National Park for a snowcoach tour to Old Faithful and the geyser basin. Along the way we had the opportunity to take photos of the wildlife foraging in the snow. Yellowstone had received eleven inches of snow the night before so everything was beautifully snow-covered. A winter trip to Yellowstone is an entirely different experience, and it is highly recommended.

Wednesday was a beautiful blue sky day for the races, and nine of our members signed up to race. We also took the opportunity to ride the gondola to the top of Lone Mountain for the 360 degree view of Big Sky and the surrounding area. This is an experience unique to Big Sky. After skiing, our group got together for dinner at The Cabin to share our adventures thus far.

Thursday night featured the TSC awards banquet. One of our new members, Peter Spielman, took second place in his age bracket in the TSC races. Peter and Chuck Gibbs also earned silver NASTAR medals, and Dave Pennington and Mike McIntyre earned bronze medals. The Dallas Ski Club took home the first place award for the Division II clubs for TSC racing. Congratulations to everyone who flew the DSC colors and raced!

Friday we had more light snow early followed by a blue sky day - the perfect way to end our week at Big Sky! We had an outstanding group of people on this trip, and I am very grateful to all of them for making my job as trip leader a pleasure.


